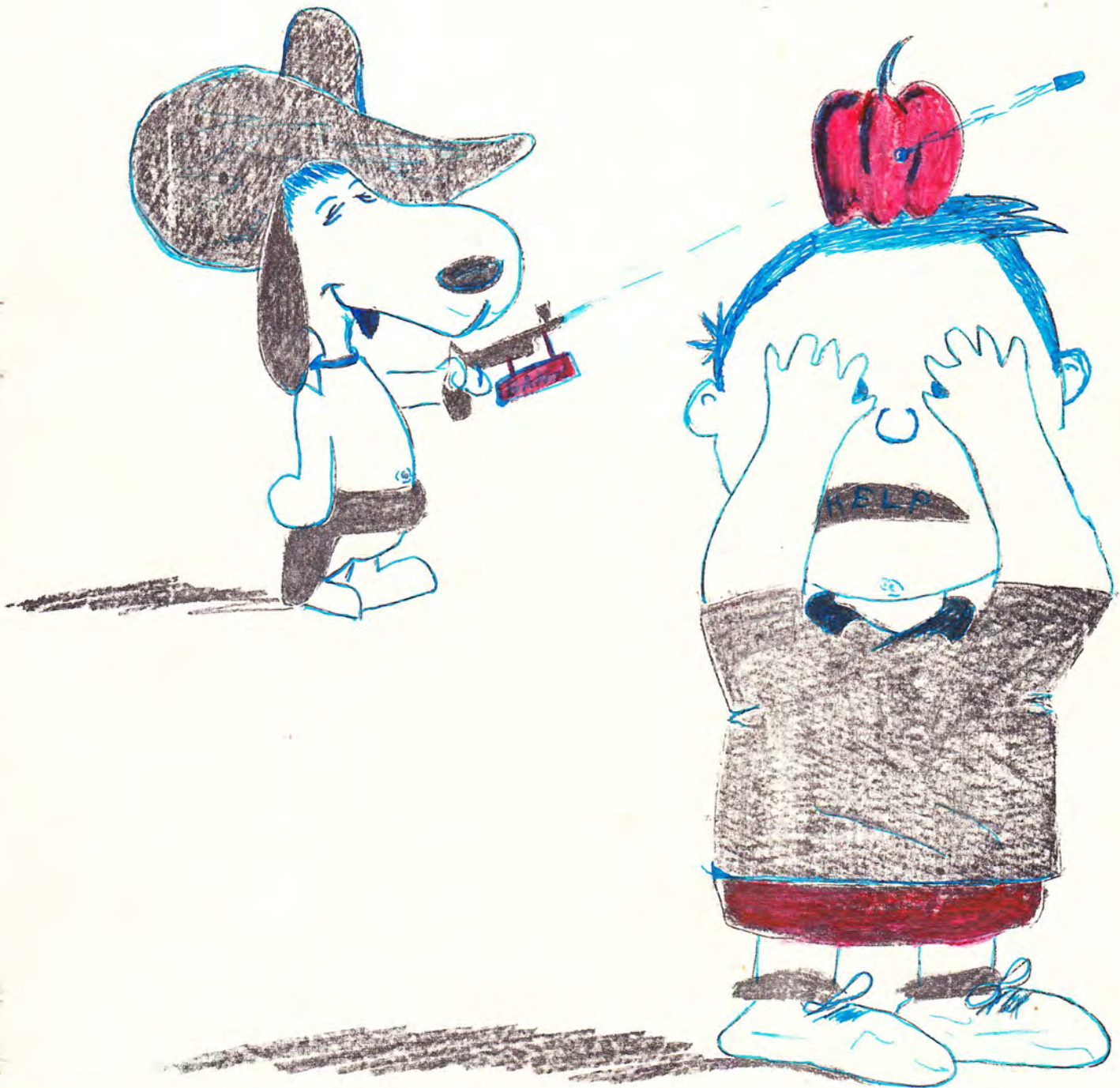

To the seventh grade we leave this as a remembrance to your first year at West. We hope that you will look back on this year with fond memories.

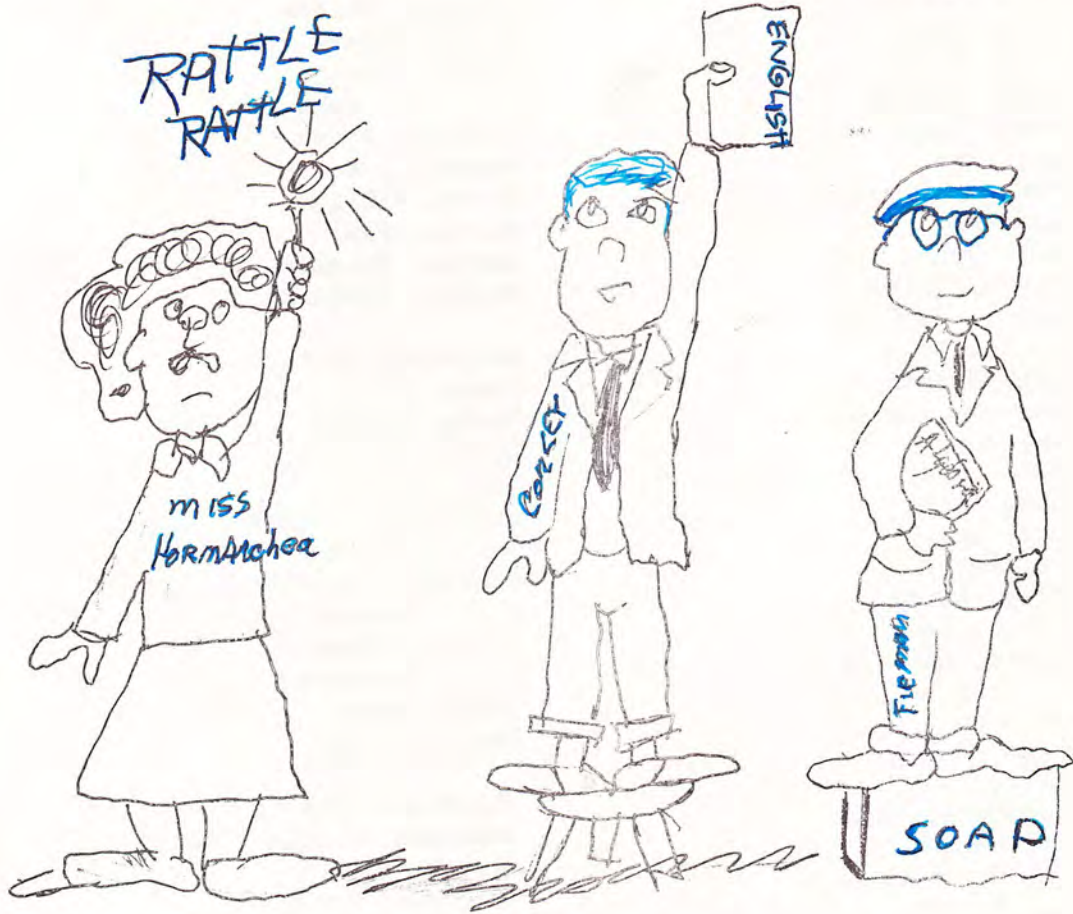
To the eighth grade this is meant to set forth a set of goals for which to shoot. You will be the leaders at West next year and it will be up to you to keep West best.

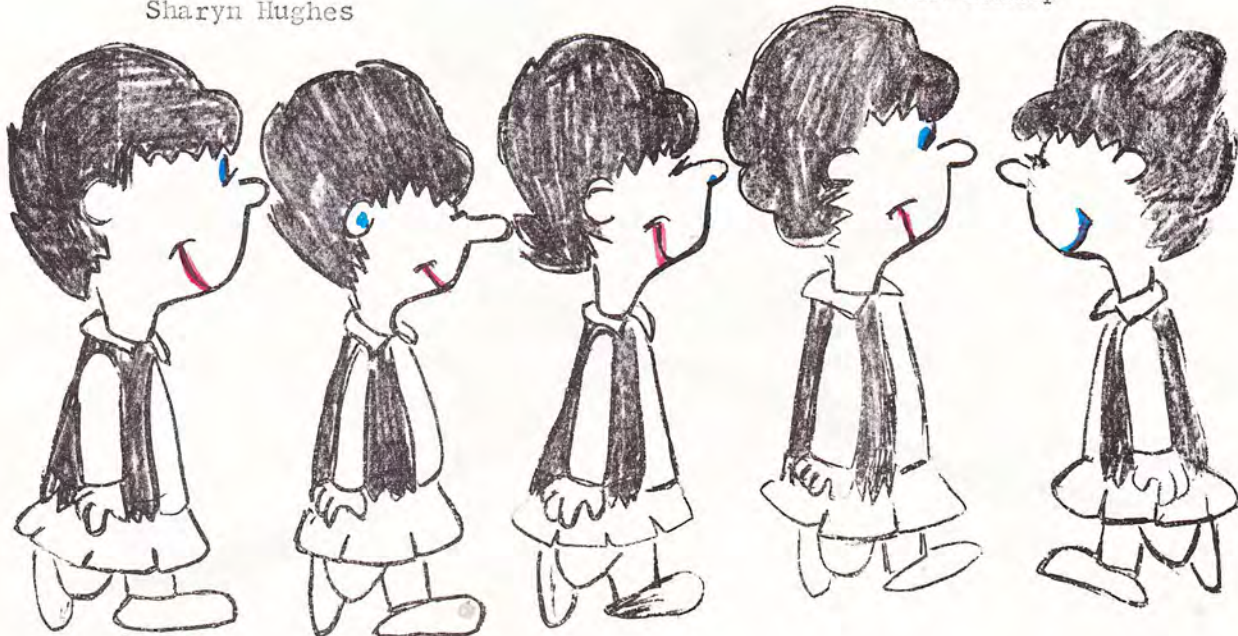

Losing three out of their first five games, there was practically no hope of getting first place. To get even a shot at tying for first, they would have to win the rest of their games, and that's exactly what they did. They ended up with a 7 win and 3 loss record, tying with South and Hillside for the championship.

This was a little more than skill. Going into the final week they had a 6 and 3 record, South had a 7 and 2, and Hillside had a 6 and 3. West then had to play East, and they won with a 49-37 victory. Then South versus Hillside was scheduled. In a triple overtime South was defeated by Hillside 50-48, the only team to beat South twice this year.

A lot of credit has to go to the man that made this possible, Coach Thompson. Mr. Thompson worked with them very hard and kept them going.

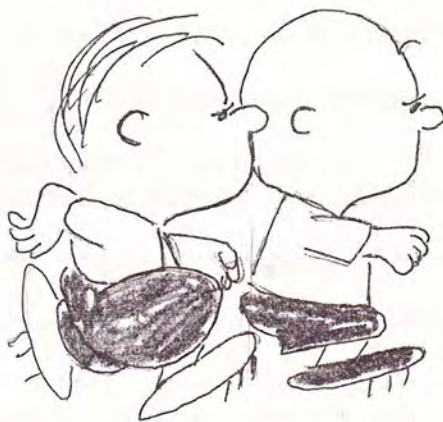

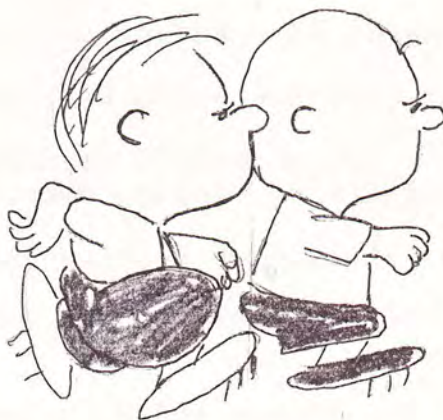

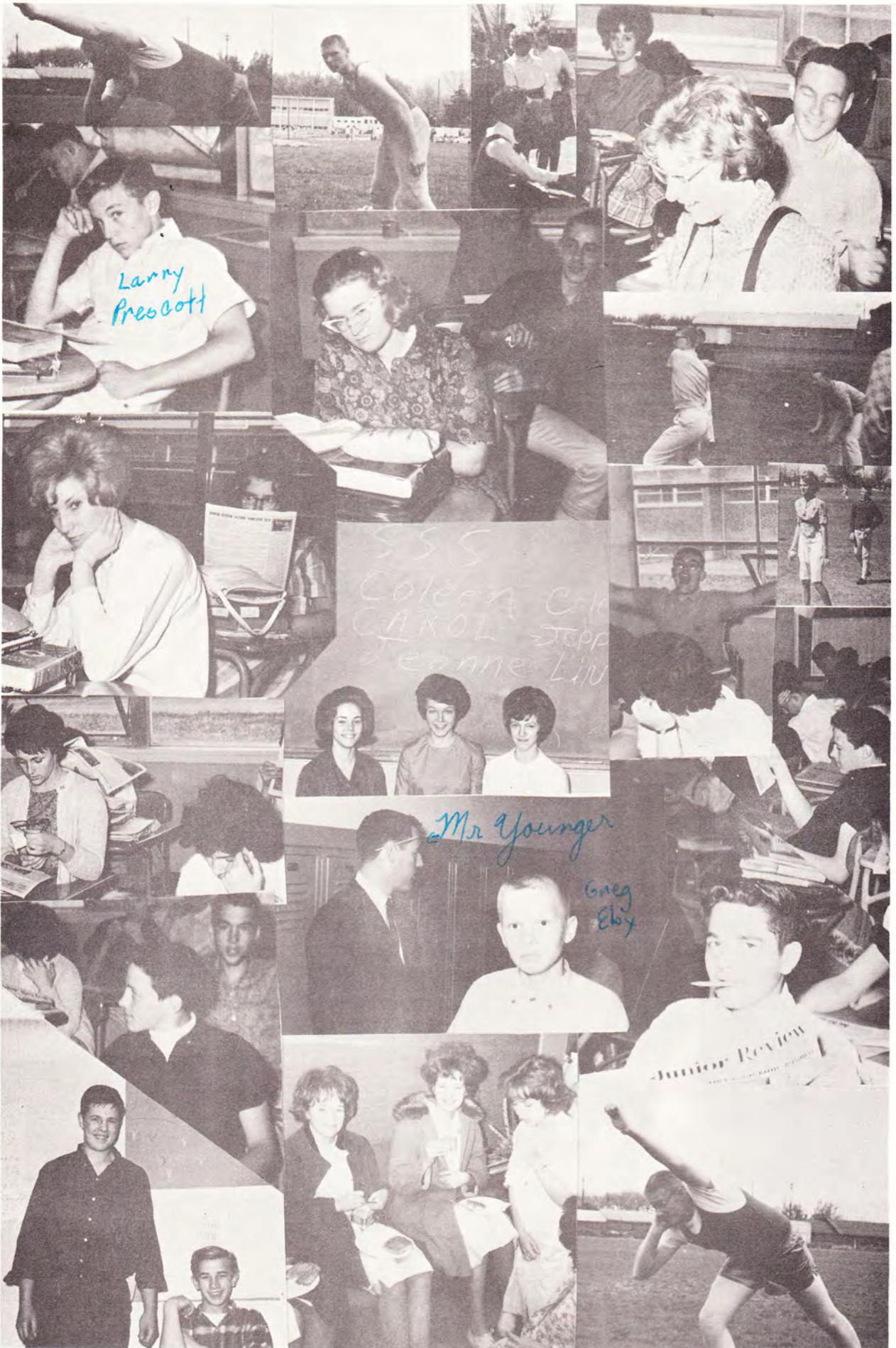
OUR DEEPEST APPRECIATION
