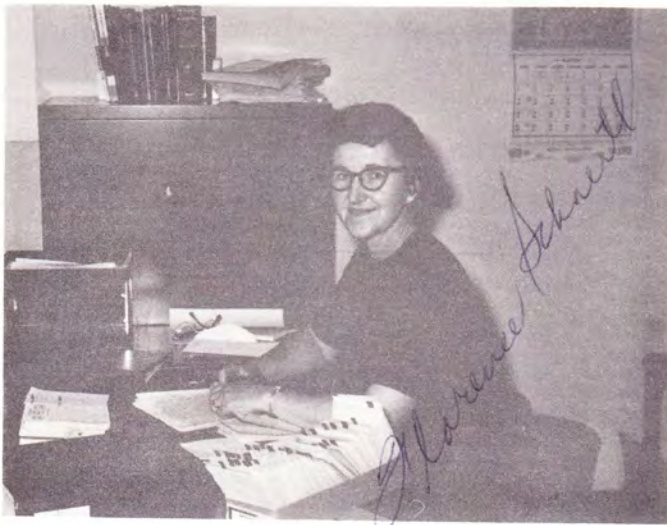
And so, we, the students of West Junior High, extend our fondest wishes and hopes for the future to you, Mr. Robinson. "Godspeed!"

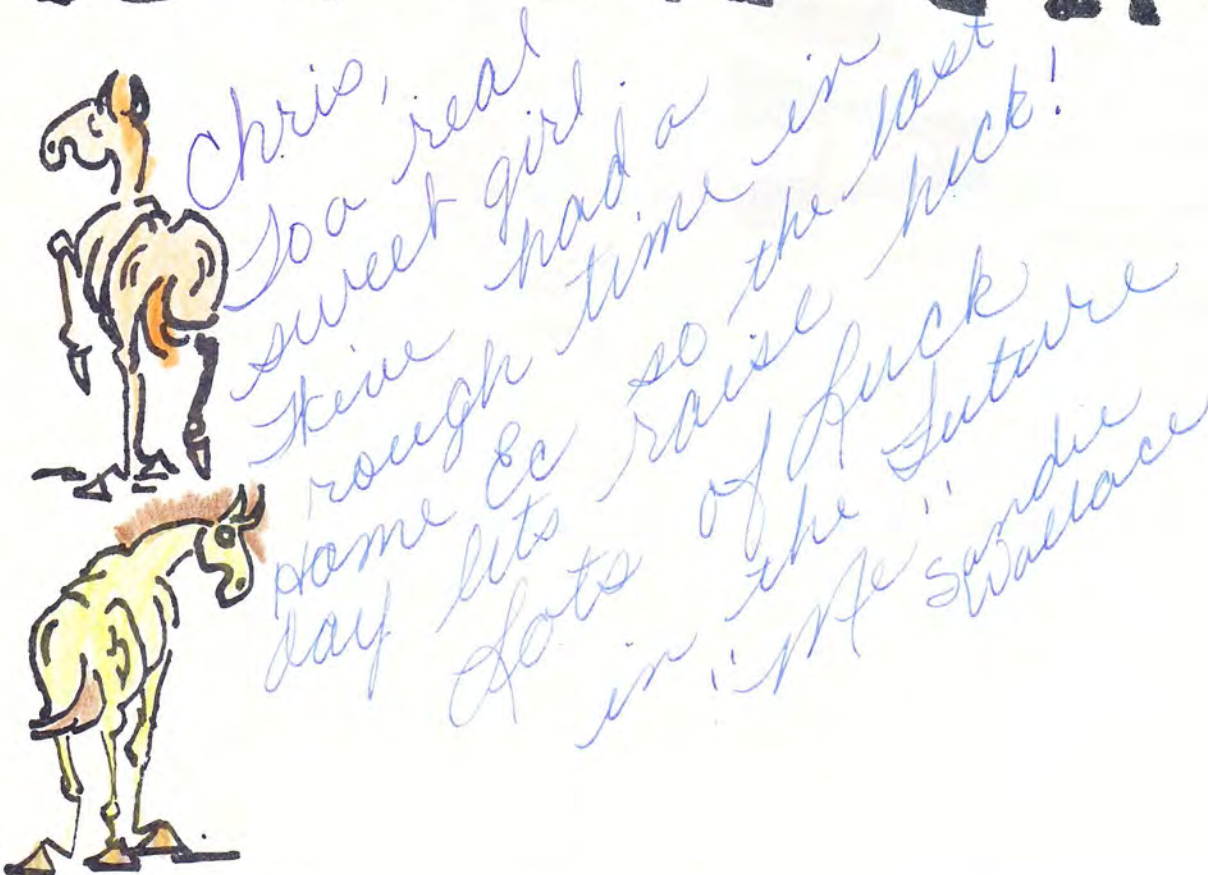

ELECTIVES



FRENCH

All the French classes this year have been using the A L M (Audio-Lingual) textbooks along with tapes for each unit. Most of the material used was for speaking purposes, but some French grammar and culture was introduced.

All five classes of French were required to turn in French scrapbooks. They were supposed to have been made over a period of four months of the school year. French customs, culture, news, geography, and other important aspects of French life were included in the books.

The arrival of an American student from France, Anna Berk, prompted further discussion of the customs.

During the weeks before Christmas vacation they learned French Christmas carols to sing in the halls. Later other folk songs and ballads were learned in French.

In February a weekly magazine, Bonjour, was offered to students wanting to learn more about the language. All students had the chance to write to a pen pal in France. Most of the letters were answered.

There are one seventh grade and three ninth grade first year classes with one eighth grade second year class.

SPANISH

Miss Squires is the Spanish teacher at West. Spanish dialogue is learned by the use of a tape recorder and the Spanish text, Entender y Hablar, which means "to understand and to speak."

The Spanish classes also learned vocabulary and conjugation of verbs in perfect, preterite, imperfect, and other tenses.

Ernesto Retana Gonzalez from Mexico City, who was visiting in Boise, came to the Spanish classes on several occasions. The students asked him questions about himself and Mexico. He also helped Miss Squires teach the students Spanish dialogues.

The Spanish studied here is not "Spanish" Spanish, but "Latin American" Spanish, which is spoken in Latin America, Mexico, and Puerto Rico.

LATIN

This year, as in previous years, Mrs. Jackson's Latin classes took time out from their declining and conjugating to serenade the classrooms with Christmas carols, naturally, sung in Latin. They also sang in the Christmas assembly.

SCIENCE

Mr. Pollard's classes started out their year in the study of the wonders of science with a unit on geology. As a project students made rock collections.

Later in the year if you had stepped into Room 24 it might have been like wandering into outer space. The science students had made a planetarium with their models of the sun and planets.

In the latter part of the year the students studied a unit on meteorology or the weather. During this time they kept a record for a month on current weather conditions.

SHOP

Mr. Plant's shop has been very busy this year. At the first of the year they learned the rudiments of basic mechanical drawing, projection, measuring views, drawing equipment, and reading and working with blueprints. The remainder of the year was consumed in learning the fundamentals of oil metals, leather, plastics, and minor machine operation. Also they learned about basic machines such as lathe, grinder, sander, buffer, drill, and band saw.

Each area had it required projects, and upon completion of these, the boys could make projects of their own choosing in the area he was assigned. The students spent about seven weeks in each area of work. Most of the students have spent about ten dollars for the year.

HOME-EC

Many people have the wrong idea about the activities of the home economics classes. They have many other projects other than just learning to make peanut butter sandwiches and sewing aprons. For instance, the girls started out the year with a unit on personal appearance and getting acquainted with the school.

After a unit on the preparation of food the girls tried out their new skills in preparing a meal for their mothers.

During the first semester the girls also studied child care. In this unit they made toys for small children.

In learning to sew the girls first learned to use the sewing machine and then made aprons. After getting some pointers on buying fabrics and patterns the girls made co-ordinated skirts and blouses.

They completed the year studying about the good care of their rooms.

ART

For all the art students at West, art has been rewarding and very interesting. To Mrs. Beulah Scheideman and Miss Estelle Will the end of the school year means the end for a time of stitchery, collage, line design, watercolor, jewelry, paper designs, clay, and egg paint work.

One of the most important events of the year was the Student Art Show, which started March 22 at the Art Gallery. MARCHING:

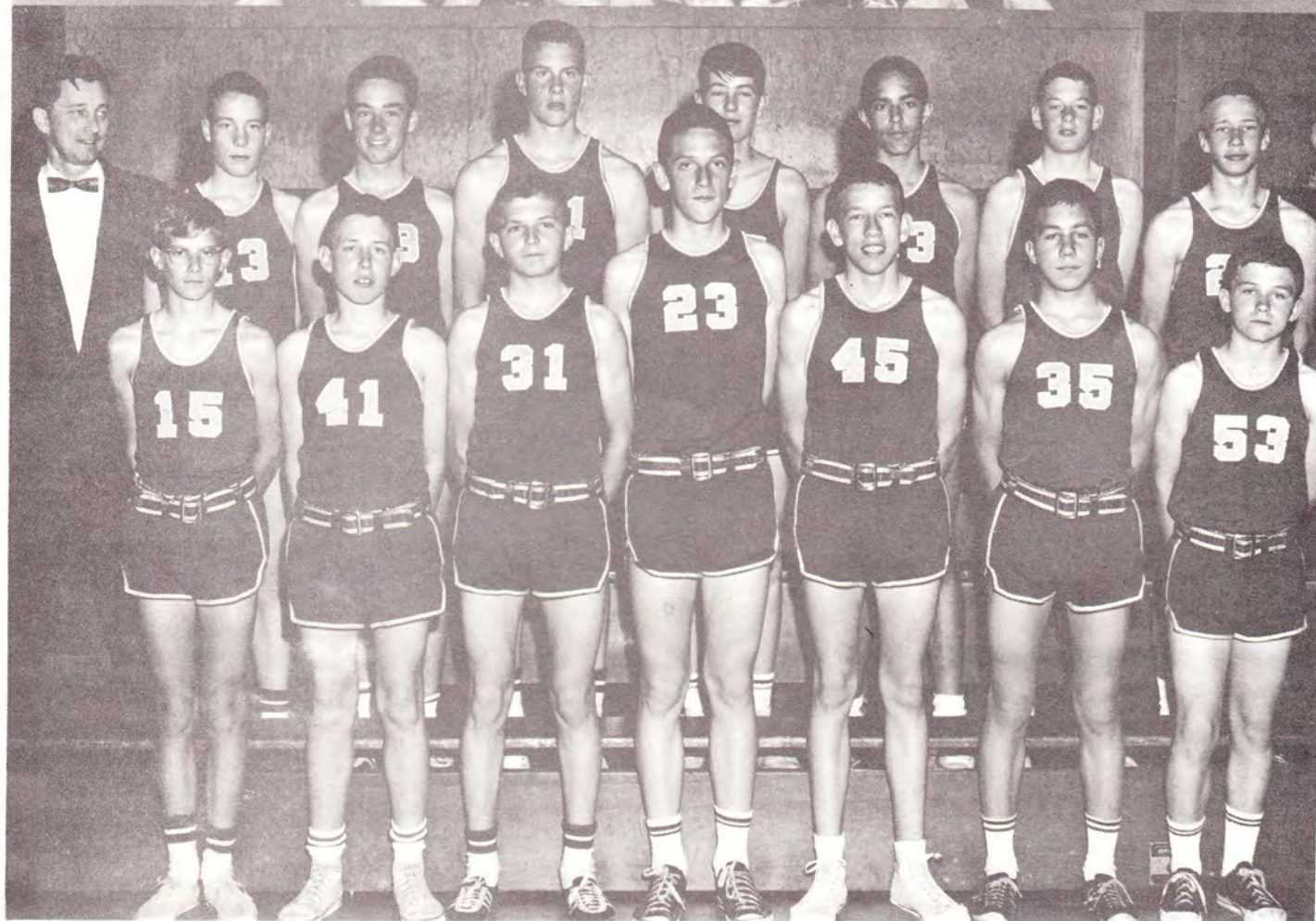

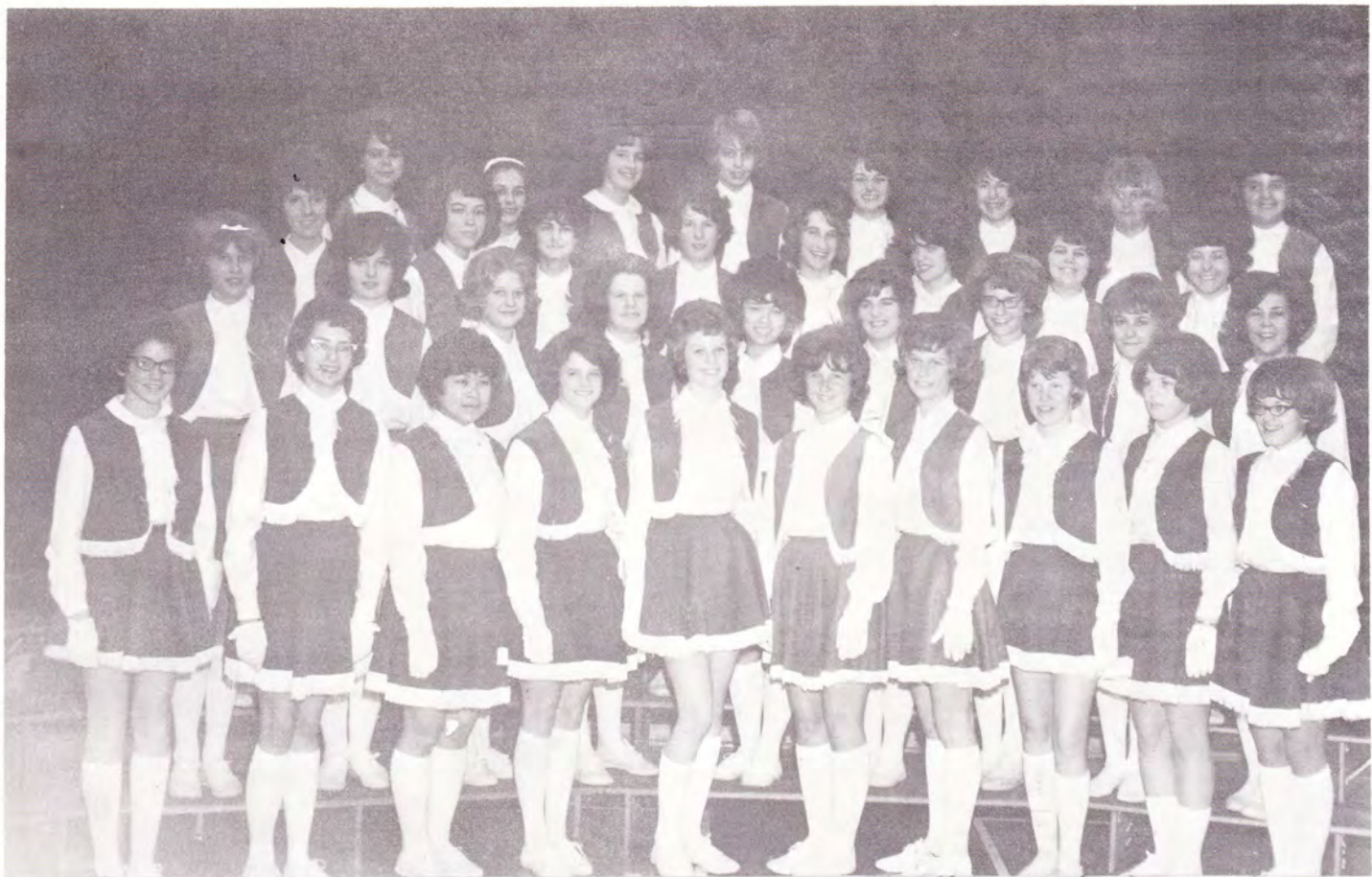

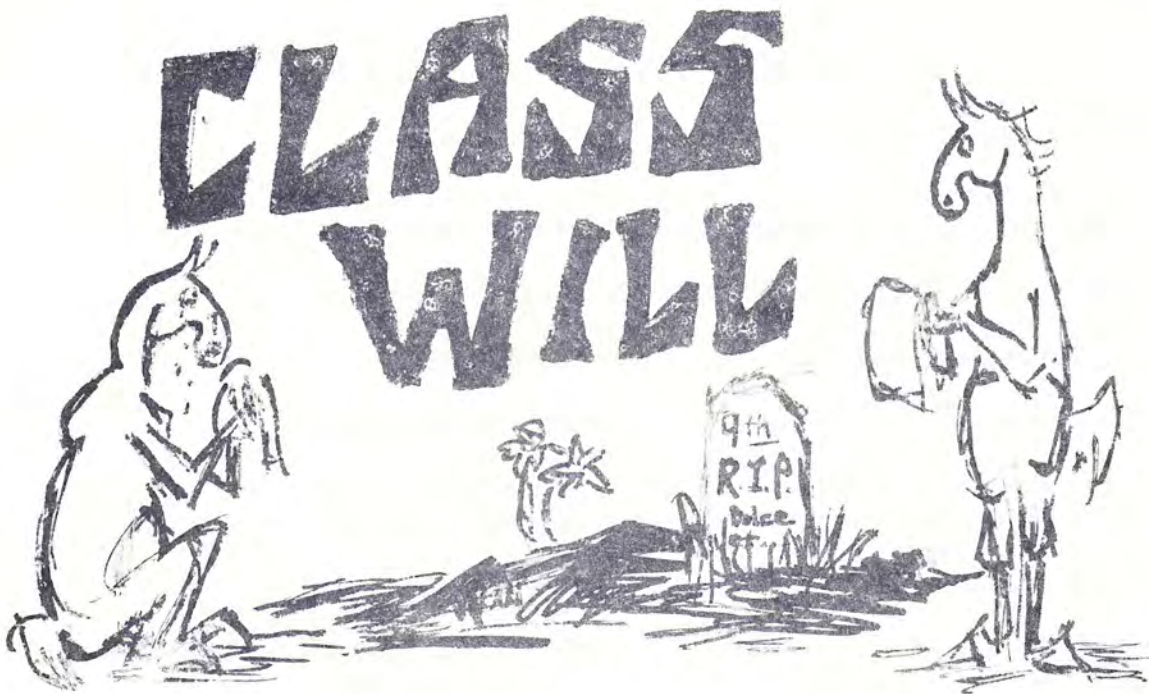
